Hobson West Home Safety Bulletin

Give your home a fighting chance against crime. Look closely at your home from the perspective of a burglar. Simple repairs and improvements may decrease the chance of your home being burglarized.

- **Lights** Keep the exterior of your home well illuminated. Criminals do not want to be detected and avoid well lit areas. Pay special attention to the lighting of your porches, yards, and especially, entrances to your home and garage.
- Locks Would-be burglars seek easy targets. They want to get in quickly, quietly and
 unseen. The harder you make it for an intruder, the lower your risk of a break-in. Install
 sturdy doors, door frames & hardware. Use deadbolt locks. Consider a door viewer; always
 know who is at your door before opening it.
 Keep your windows locked and consider pinning them.
- Landscaping Overgrown limbs, bushes or landscaping could block a neighbor or passerby from observing a break-in. Trees and shrubbery should be kept trimmed back from sidewalks, porches and doorways. Keep in mind that high wooden fences may allow criminals to slip onto your property and work unobserved.
- Vehicles Do not leave vehicles unattended with the doors unlocked, windows down, or the
 keys in them, even in your garage or driveway. Do not leave valuables, such as cell phones,
 I-Pods, GPS units, computers, purses, or money in plain view. Remember, if a criminal has
 access to the inside of your vehicle, they likely have access to your garage door opener
 and/or house keys.

Remember...

Just because a point-of-entry is not located at ground level does not make it inaccessible to intruders. Do not leave ladders, garbage cans or other items lying around. These items can be used to gain access to an elevated point-of-entry.

Be observant of the activities in and around your neighborhood, crime can occur at any time. The Naperville Police Department requests citizens to report all suspicious subjects, vehicles & incidents. Call 911 to report in-progress activity.
